A TINY WARRIOR'S INSPIRING JOURNEY HOME

Some victories cannot be measured by numbers — they are measured in hope, courage, and joyful smiles. One of the most memorable moments of July was the successful discharge of the Baby of Mr. KashishAthawale from our Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

Born weighing only 900 grams, this tiny warrior fought every challenge with incredible resilience. During the NICU stay, the baby underwent life-saving colostomy surgery following intestinal perforation and received continuous specialized neonatal intensive care.

For more than two months, every heartbeat was closely monitored, every gram of weight gain was celebrated, and every milestone became a victory. Behind this remarkable recovery stood an exceptional multidisciplinary team of Neonatologists, Pediatric Surgeons, NICU Nurses, Anaesthesiologists, Dietitians, and Support Staff, working tirelessly alongside the family's unwavering faith.

On 21 July 2026, weighing 1.850 kg, the baby was finally discharged home healthy and stable — a reminder that miracles happen when advanced medical science meets compassionate nursing care.

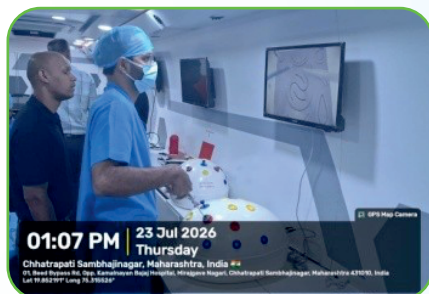
Patient safety begins with awareness, responsibility, and timely action. During routine verification of medicines brought from outside by a patient's relatives, Ms. Rameshwari Taur identified that several medicines — including the emergency life-saving drug Injection Adrenaline — had expired nearly one year earlier.

Her prompt identification and strict adherence to protocol prevented the administration of expired medication and averted a potentially life-threatening patient safety incident.



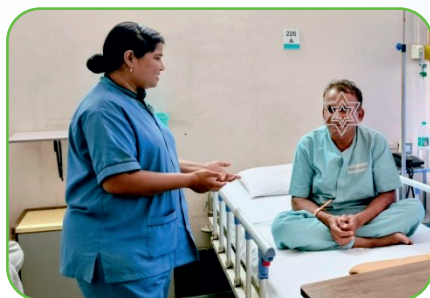
JOHNSON & JOHNSON INSTITUTE ON WHEELS (JJIW)

Kamalnayan Bajaj Hospital, in collaboration with the Johnson & Johnson Institute on Wheels (JJIW) and Ethicon, successfully conducted a two-day simulation-based Surgical Skills Training Programme on 23rd and 24th July 2026. More than 70 participants – Nursing Staff, Resident Doctors, OT Technicians, and Nursing College Students – took part in this advanced hands-on learning experience covering suturing and knot-tying, wet-lab practice, stapled and stapleless skin closure, advanced haemostasis, and team-based surgical practice.
